## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ninety-Two.

AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING PENSIONS FOR JUSTICES AND COURT OFFICERS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 65A of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as appearing  
2 in the 1988 Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after  
3 the word "paid", in line 22, the following sentence: — A said chief  
4 justice, justice, associate justice, judge, or associate judge of any  
5 such court or courts, subject to the above limitations and, who  
6 after having served in any such office or offices at least ten years  
7 continuously, notwithstanding that this continuous service may  
8 involve one or more appointments made subsequent to January  
9 second, nineteen hundred and seventy-five, and having attained  
10 the age of sixty years but not having attained the age of seventy  
11 years, shall retire from or resign his office, shall thereupon be  
12 entitled to receive a pension for life at an annual rate equal to  
13 one half of the annual rate of salary payable to him at the time  
14 of such resignation or retirement, to be paid from the same source  
15 and in the same manner as the salaries of like judicial officers of  
16 his court are paid.
