### AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE ISSUANCE OF DISTINCTIVE REGISTRATION PLATES FOR OCCUPATIONS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 2 of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as amended by  
2 section 151 of chapter 138 of the acts of 1991, is hereby further  
3 amended by adding the following paragraph: —

4 The registrar may, upon application, furnish to owners of  
5 private passenger motor vehicles distinctive registration plates  
6 which recite the occupation of the applicant; provided, however,  
7 that the applicant presents satisfactory evidence of such  
8 occupation. There shall be a twenty-five dollar fee for said plates  
9 in addition to the established registration fee for passenger motor  
10 vehicles. The registrar shall determine the occupations or  
11 categories thereof for which such plates shall be available.
