The committee on Local Affairs, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 872) of Matthew J. Amorello for legislation to change the membership of the Westborough Treatment Plant Board, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 600) of Robert C. Lawless relative to the groundwater protection district within the towns of Orleans, Brewster and Eastham, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3614) of Thomas S. Cahir (by vote of the town) for legislation to authorize the town of Bourne to establish a revolving fund for the propagation, cultivation, protection and study of shellfish, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3615) of Thomas S. Cahir (by vote of the town) relative to the preparation of the annual report in the town of Bourne, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 4134) of Stephen W. Doran and Robert A. Havern (by vote of the town) for legislation to authorize the town of Lexington to establish an "enterprise fund" for the disposal of solid waste, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5401) ought to pass.

1 *Ordered*, That the committee on Local Affairs be authorized
2 to sit during the recess of the General Court for the purpose of
3 making an investigation and study of the current Senate document
4 numbered 872, and current House documents numbered 600,
5 3614, 3615 and 4134, relative to the membership of the
6 Westborough Treatment Plant Board; the Orleans, Brewster, and
7 Eastham Ground Water Protection District; establishing a
8 revolving fund for the propagation, cultivation, protection and
9 study of shellfish; annual reports in the town of Bourne; an
10 enterprise fund for the disposition of solid waste in the town of
11 Lexington.

12 Said committee shall report the results of its investigation and
13 study and its recommendations, if any, to the General Court,
14 together with the draft of legislation necessary to carry such
15 recommendations into effect by filing the same with the Clerk of
16 the House of Representatives or the Clerk of the Senate on or
17 before the last Wednesday in December, nineteen hundred and
18 ninety-two.
