The committee on Criminal Justice, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, Senate, No. 182) of James E. Ribiero and Charles E. Shannon for legislation relative to the holding in protective custody of persons arrested for driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 317) of M. Joseph Manning for legislation to require the testing of persons arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1647) of Paul E. Caron and James P. Jajuga for legislation to provide for the testing of persons for narcotics when arrested for driving under the influence of intoxicating beverages, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1650) of Carol C. Cleven, Paul E. Caron, Patricia D. Jehlen, Lida E. Harkins, Marie-Louise Kehoe and Barbara Gardner for legislation to further regulate the consumption and possession of alcoholic beverages in motor vehicles, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2039) of J. Michael Ruane for legislation to increase the penalties for certain motor vehicle offenses, the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3145) of Thomas G. Palumbo and Larry F. Giordano for legislation to further regulate the disposition of criminal cases involving driving under the influence of alcohol, and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 5162) of J. James Marzilli, Jr., and Robert A. Antonioni for legislation to provide for the treatment of certain young persons convicted of driving under the influence of alcohol and drugs, reports recommending that the accompanying order (House, No. 5444) ought to be adopted.

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1 *Ordered*, That the committee on Criminal Justice be  
2 authorized during the recess of the General Court to make an  
3 investigation and study of Senate document numbered 182 and  
4 House documents numbered 317, 1265, 1647, 1650, 2039, 3145 and  
5 5162, relative to the operating under the influence laws and  
6 consumption of alcoholic beverages in motor vehicles.

7 Said Committee shall report to the General Court the results  
8 of its investigation and study, and its recommendations, if any,  
9 together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry such  
10 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the Clerk  
11 of the House on or before the last Wednesday in December,  
12 nineteen hundred and ninety-two.
