

HOUSE No. 5841

By Mr. Businger of Brookline, petition of Michael W. Merrill, John A. Businger, Lois G. Pines and others (by vote of the town) for legislation to exempt the position of chief of police of the town of Brookline from the provisions of civil service law. Public Service. [Local Approval Received.]

AN ACT EXEMPTING THE POSITION OF CHIEF OF POLICE OF THE TOWN OF BROOKLINE FROM THE PROVISIONS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The position of police chief in the Town of
2 Brookline shall be exempt from provisions of Chapter 31 of the
3 General Laws. Any appointment of a police chief in the Town
4 of Brookline under the provisions of this section one shall be made
5 under a contract for a term of not less than four years.

1 SECTION 2. The provisions of section one shall not impair the
2 civil service status of any person holding the position of police
3 chief in the Town of Brookline on the effective date of this act
4 nor of any person appointed to the position of police chief in the
5 Town of Brookline from the eligible list resulting from the May 2,
6 1992 civil service examination for police chief.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
