HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, August 3, 1966.

The committee on Counties on the part of the House, to whom were referred the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1380) of J. Raymond Rothermel for legislation to transfer the Suffolk County Jail to the Department of Correction and providing for the relocation of the facilities thereof and a study by said department relative to the transfer of land and buildings thereat to the Boston redevelopment authority; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1436) of Edwin H. Morse for legislation to increase the salary of the justice of the Fourth District Court of Plymouth and providing that he shall devote full time to his official duties; the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1778) of John F. Dolan for legislation to increase the salary of the justice of the Third District Court of Essex and providing that he shall devote full time to his judicial duties; and the petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2464) of David E. Harrison for abolishing the District Court of Eastern Essex, creating the district court of Gloucester as a full time court and transferring certain personnel thereto, report the accompanying order (House, No. 3940).

1 *Ordered*, That the Joint Committee on Counties is hereby
2 authorized and directed to sit during the recess of the general
3 court for the purpose of making an investigation and study of
4 the subject matter of current house documents numbered 1380,
5 to transfer Suffolk county jail to the commonwealth, to pro-
6 vide a study of the relocation of the Suffolk county jail and to
7 authorize the conveyance of the land and buildings relating
8 thereto to the Boston Redevelopment Authority; 1436, rela-
9 tive to the fourth district court of Plymouth; 1778, increasing
10 the salary of the justice of the third district court of Essex
11 and providing that he shall devote full time to his judicial
12 duties; and 2464, abolishing the district court of eastern Essex,
13 creating the district court of Gloucester as a full time court and
14 transferring certain personnel thereto. Said committee shall
15 be provided with quarters in the state house or elsewhere, and
16 may expend for clerical and other services and expenses such
17 sums as may be appropriated therefor. Said committee shall
18 report to the general court the results of its investigation and
19 study, and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of
20 such legislation as may be necessary to carry such recommenda-
21 tions into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the house
22 of representatives on or before the last Wednesday of December,
23 nineteen hundred and sixty-six.
