RESOLUTIONS MEMORIALIZING THE CONGRESS OF THE UNITED STATES TO INCREASE THE AMOUNT OF CONTRIBUTION UNDER THE FEDERAL WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT TO MUNICIPALITIES CONSTRUCTING POLLUTION CONTROL PROJECTS.

1 *Resolved*, That the general court of Massachusetts respect-
2 fully urges the Congress of the United States to amend the
3 Federal Water Pollution Control Act by providing that the
4 contribution of the federal government to municipalities con-
5 structing water pollution control facilities be increased to an
6 amount equal to forty per cent of the estimated reasonable
7 cost of such facilities.
