

HOUSE No. 1294.

[Amendments moved by Messrs. Bouvé of Hingham and James H. Mellen of Worcester to the Bill to incorporate the Massachusetts Pipe Line Company, House, No. 1225.]

Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

Mr. BOUVÉ of Hingham moves to amend House bill 1225 in section 4, line 5, by striking out the words "or private," and also the word "lands." Also in the eleventh line by inserting after the word "works" the words "within such locations and subject to the approval of the aldermen of the city or the selectmen of the town within which such ways, water-courses, railroads, railways, canals, bridges or subways are located."

Also by inserting the words "But nothing herein shall be construed as authorizing the location by said company of any of its pipes, lines, works, conduits, manholes or machinery in, over, through, under or upon any cemetery or public park or common or public reservation in the nature of a park, without first having obtained the consent of the park commissioners or other authorities having control of such parks, commons or public reservations in the nature of parks."

In the twenty-seventh line of section 5, by striking out the word "reasonable."

In the thirty-seventh line by inserting after the word "opened" the words "and to the satisfaction of the local authorities of the city or town in which such streets, lanes or highways are located."

By amending the amendment moved by Mr. Lowell of Boston, to section 5, by striking out all after the word "respectively" in said amendment.

Mr. JAMES H. MELLE of Worcester moves to amend in section 8, line 7, by striking out the word "thirty-five," and inserting the word "twenty."

Also by striking out all of section 10, after the word "cents," in line 11.
