AN ACT PROVIDING THAT MEETINGS OF THE CITY COUNCIL AND OF ALL OTHER BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS IN THE CITY OF REVERE BE OPEN TO THE PUBLIC WITH THE PUBLIC HAVING AN OPPORTUNITY TO BE HEARD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 In addition to the provisions of section twenty-three A of
2 chapter thirty-nine of the General Laws, relative to open
3 meetings, notice thereof, the keeping of records and the method
4 of voting at such meetings, all meetings of the city council
5 of the city of Revere and of other boards or commissions in
6 said city shall be open to the public and to the press, and at
7 such meetings all persons interested shall have opportunity
8 to be heard in regard to any matter considered thereat.
