The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Five.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF BOSTON TO GRANT PERMITS FOR CERTAIN ENCROACHMENTS IN PUBLIC WAYS IN SAID CITY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The public improvement commission of the city of Boston
2 may grant permits for the placing and maintaining of orna-
3 mental facing not to exceed six inches and copings not to ex-
4 ceed eighteen inches projecting into or placed on or over pub-
5 lic ways in said city and may make rules and regulations
6 relating thereto, and prescribe penalties for a breach of any
7 such rules and regulations, not exceeding five dollars for each
8 day during which any structure is placed or maintained con-
9 trary to the rules and regulations so made, after five days'
10 notice to remove the same has been given by said public im-
11 provement commission. All such structures shall be con-
12 structed and connected to buildings in accordance with the
13 requirements of the building commissioner of said city.

The Constitution of the United States

Article I, Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be admitted into or excluded from this Union according to their respective Numbers, which shall be determined by adding to the whole Number of free Persons, including all bound Persons for Service or Labour, and three fifths of all other Persons, all Persons bound to Service and Labour in the said States, the Number of free Persons in each State, as determined by the last Enumeration or General Census.

Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be admitted into or excluded from this Union according to their respective Numbers, which shall be determined by adding to the whole Number of free Persons, including all bound Persons for Service or Labour, and three fifths of all other Persons, all Persons bound to Service and Labour in the said States, the Number of free Persons in each State, as determined by the last Enumeration or General Census.
