AN ACT LIMITING EXPENDITURES FOR ELECTION TO PUBLIC OFFICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 27 of chapter 55 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after the clause contained in lines 7 to 9,
3 inclusive, as appearing in section 10 of chapter 537 of the acts
4 of 1946, the following clause: — Expending or permitting any
5 person or non-elected political committee authorized by him
6 to expend a total amount of money which shall be greater than
7 the annual salary of the office to which such candidate aspires.
