AN ACT PROVIDING FOR AN ADDITIONAL JUDGE OF PROBATE
IN SUFFOLK AND MIDDLESEX COUNTIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 217 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking out the first sentence, as most
3 recently amended by section 1 of chapter 817 of the acts of
4 1960, and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:—
5 There shall be four judges of probate in the counties of Suffolk
6 and Middlesex, and three judges of probate in Norfolk, and
7 two judges of probate in each of the counties of Essex,
8 Worcester, Hampden and Bristol.

1 SECTION 2. The additional judges of Probate shall be used
2 by the Chief Justice of Probate, at his complete discretion to
3 sit in other counties other than the counties for which they
4 were appointed and for such periods of time as he shall de-
5 termine.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect on passage.
