AN ACT DIRECTING THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION TO
CONSTRUCT AN ARTIFICIAL ICE SKATING RINK IN THE EAST BOSTON
DISTRICT OF THE CITY OF BOSTON.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General
Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 The metropolitan district commission is hereby authorized
- 2 and directed to construct an artificial ice skating rink in the
- 3 East Boston district of the city of Boston. For said purpose
- 4 said commission may expend such sums as may be appropri-
- 5 ated therefor.

The Government of the State

The Government of the State is composed of the Executive, the Legislative and the Judicial branches.

The Executive branch is headed by the Governor, who is elected by the people for a term of four years. The Governor has the honor and the power of pardon, and he is the commander in chief of the State militia.

The Legislative branch is composed of the Senate and the House of Representatives. The Senate is elected by the people for a term of six years, and the House of Representatives is elected for a term of two years.

1. The Legislature has the power to pass laws, to impeach and remove the Governor, and to impeach and remove the Justices of the Supreme Court.
2. The Legislature also has the power to appropriate money for the support of the State government, and to regulate the public lands.
3. The Legislature has the power to create and abolish offices, and to fix the salaries of the officers thereof.
4. The Legislature has the power to regulate the commerce of the State, and to regulate the public schools.
5. The Legislature has the power to regulate the public health, and to regulate the public morals.
6. The Legislature has the power to regulate the public safety, and to regulate the public order.
7. The Legislature has the power to regulate the public education, and to regulate the public charities.
8. The Legislature has the power to regulate the public works, and to regulate the public utilities.
9. The Legislature has the power to regulate the public lands, and to regulate the public forests.
10. The Legislature has the power to regulate the public parks, and to regulate the public monuments.
