AN ACT PROHIBITING THE SALE OF PRODUCTS CONTAINING OPIUM OR
DERIVATIVES THEREOF BY STORES OTHER THAN DRUG STORES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The fifth paragraph of section 187A of chapter 94 of the
2 General Laws is hereby amended by adding at the end the
3 following sentence: — No store, other than a retail drug
4 store, shall sell or offer for sale any product containing opium
5 or any preparation thereof or any salt, compound or derivative
6 of the same.
