The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Five.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO REIMBURSING THE COMMONWEALTH FOR ANY AMOUNTS WHICH IT MAY HAVE PAID TO THE WOODS HOLE, MARTHA'S VINEYARD AND NANTUCKET STEAMSHIP AUTHORITY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 2-9 of chapter seven hundred one of
2 the acts of nineteen hundred and sixty is hereby amended by
3 adding to the ninth of its thirteen paragraphs the clause: —
4 provided, however, that no reimbursement to the common-
5 wealth shall be made unless and until the Authority has re-
7 surplus from investments of trust funds and thereafter accumu-
8 lated a surplus from operations of two hundred thousand
9 dollars.

1 SECTION 2. Any funds obtained by the Authority as a result
2 of its operations in nineteen hundred sixty-three and nineteen
3 hundred sixty-four and now held in escrow may be used and
4 classified by the Authority as reimbursement for past accum-
5 ulated deficits from operations.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
