## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Five.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE COMPENSATION OF THE PUBLIC ACCOUNTANT MEMBER OF THE BOARD OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTANCY FOR THE PERFORMANCE OF HIS DUTIES IN CALENDAR YEAR NINETEEN HUNDRED AND SIXTY-FIVE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 The public accountant member of the board of public ac-
- 2 countancy shall not receive as compensation for the perform-
- 3 ance of his duties in calendar year nineteen hundred and
- 4 sixty-five more than five thousand dollars, but may, notwith-
- 5 standing any provision of section thirty-five of chapter thirteen
- 6 of the General Laws to the contrary, receive more than three
- 7 thousand dollars for the performance of his duties in said year.
