AN ACT REDEFINING THE TERM "REST HOME" AS USED IN THE LAW REGULATING THE LICENSING OF SUCH HOMES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 71 of chapter 111 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by striking out the seventeenth sentence, as amended
- 3 by chapter 285 of the acts of 1963, and inserting in place
- 4 thereof the following sentence: — A rest home is defined as
- 5 any institution, however named, which is advertised, an-
- 6 nounced or maintained for the express or implied purpose of
- 7 providing care incident to old age to three or more persons
- 8 who are ambulatory and who need supervision.
