AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF BARNSTABLE TO TRANSFER THE MANAGEMENT AND CONTROL OF CERTAIN LAND OWNED BY IT, INCLUDING PARK LAND, TO THE JOINT CONTROL OF THE CONSERVATION COMMISSION AND THE BOARD OF SELECTMEN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any contrary provision of sec-
2 tion fifteen A of chapter forty of the General Laws, the town
3 of Barnstable is hereby authorized to transfer the care, custody,
4 management and control of all land owned by said town at
5 Sandy Neck and being easterly of the town beach and parking
6 area, part of said land having been acquired for and being
7 devoted to park uses and part having been acquired for play-
8 ground and recreation purposes, to the joint care and custody
9 of the board of selectmen and the town conservation com-
10 mission. All of said land shall hereafter be maintained in its
11 natural state, and shall be for the benefit and enjoyment of
12 all citizens.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its acceptance
2 by the town of Barnstable.
