## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Five.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE OFFICE OF SCHOOL LUNCH PROGRAMS IN THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO ESTABLISH STANDARDS AND QUALIFICATIONS FOR CERTAIN FOOD SERVICE PERSONNEL IN PUBLIC SCHOOLS AND TO ESTABLISH TRAINING PROGRAMS FOR SUCH PERSONNEL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 4 of chapter 548 of the acts of 1948,

2 inserted by chapter 417 of the acts of 1950, is hereby amended

3 by striking out, in line 8, the word "division" each time it

4 occurs and inserting in place thereof, in each instance, the

5 word: — office, — and by adding at the end the following

6 sentence: — The office of school lunch programs may by

7 regulations establish standards and qualifications, which shall

8 be subject to the approval of the board of education for the

9 positions of school lunch supervisors, managers and other

10 food service personnel who are not subject to chapter thirty-

11 one of the General Laws, and establish training programs for

12 such personnel.

1 Section 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of section four 2 of chapter five hundred and forty-eight of the acts of nine-

3 teen hundred and forty-eight, as amended by section one of

4 this act, any standards and qualifications established by regu-

5 lation thereunder for school lunch supervisors, managers and

6 other food service personnel who are not subject to chapter

7 thirty-one of the General Laws, shall not take effect until 8 two years after the promulgation of said regulations by the

9 office of school lunch programs, nor shall such standards and

10 qualifications apply to any such person who was employed in

11 school food service by a school committee immediately prior

12 to the effective date of such regulations.
