RESOLVE EXTENDING THE TIME WITHIN WHICH THE SPECIAL COMMISSION ESTABLISHED TO MAKE AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY RELATIVE TO ILLEGAL USE OF ELECTRONIC RECORDING DEVICES, WIRELESS TAPS OR ELECTRONIC TAPS OR SIMILAR DEVICES AND ARRANGEMENTS SHALL COMPLETE ITS INVESTIGATION AND STUDY AND FILE ITS FINAL REPORT, AND INCREASING THE SCOPE THEREOF.

1 *Resolved*, That the time within which the special commission  
 2 established by chapter eighty-two of the resolves of nineteen  
 3 hundred and sixty-four, and most recently revived and con-  
 4 tinued by chapter sixty-nine of the resolves of nineteen hun-  
 5 dred and sixty-five, shall complete its investigation and study  
 6 and file its final report is hereby extended to the first Wednes-  
 7 day of December, nineteen hundred and sixty-six. Said com-  
 8 mission shall also study and investigate the manner by which  
 9 communications by wire, radio and word-of-mouth may be  
 10 overheard or otherwise intercepted without the knowledge,  
 11 consent or authorization of either or all parties to a communi-  
 12 cation. Said commission shall have the power to summon  
 13 witnesses, and to require the production of books, records,  
 14 contracts and papers, and the giving of testimony under oath.
