The committee on Ways and Means, to whom was committed the House bill authorizing and directing the department of public works to prepare plans and specifications for a highway and bridge connecting in Route 3 in the town of Chelmsford and the Pawtucket Boulevard in the city of Lowell and to relocate a portion of Route 113 (House, No. 1929, amended), reports recommending that the same ought to pass, with an amendment, substituting a "Resolve authorizing and directing the Department of Public Works to make a study and survey of the most feasible location for a bridge across the Merrimack River in the city of Lowell" (Senate, No. 1260).

RESOLVE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO MAKE A STUDY AND SURVEY OF THE MOST FEASIBLE LOCATION FOR A BRIDGE ACROSS THE MERRIMACK RIVER IN THE CITY OF LOWELL.

1 *Resolved*, That the department of public works is hereby
2 authorized and directed to make a study and survey in order
3 to determine the most feasible location for a bridge across the
4 Merrimack river in the city of Lowell and suitable approaches
5 thereto connecting with the relocated Route 3 and the Paw-
6 tucket boulevard, so called, on the north side of said river.
7 Said department shall report to the general court the results
8 of its study and survey and its recommendations, as to such
9 location, by filing the same with the clerk of the house of
10 representatives on or before the last Wednesday of Decem-
11 ber, nineteen hundred and sixty-six.
