AN ACT CLARIFYING THE STATUS OF CERTAIN APPOINTEES IN THE SERVICE OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

1 Section 42 of chapter 31 of the General Laws, as most
2 recently amended by chapter 364 of the acts of 1966, is
3 hereby amended by striking out the last sentence and insert-
4 ing in place thereof the following sentence:—No person ap-
5 pointed to any position under this section shall be classified
6 under the civil service laws and rules, provided, however, a
7 person appointed to a position under this section shall not be
8 precluded from any promotional examination as provided in
9 section fifteen of said chapter thirty-one.
