AN ACT REPEALING THE LAW PROVIDING FOR PRE-PRIMARY CONVENTIONS OF POLITICAL PARTIES AND REVIVING AND CONTINUING IN FORCE CERTAIN OTHER LAWS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 All provisions of sections fifty-four, fifty-four C, fifty-four D
2 of chapter fifty-three of the General Laws, as most recently
3 amended by chapter two hundred and thirty of the acts of
4 nineteen hundred and fifty-eight, providing for state conven-
5 tions of political parties for the endorsement for nomination
6 of candidates for offices to be filled by all the voters of the
7 commonwealth, and all other laws relative to such conven-
8 tions, are hereby repealed. All provisions of law which have
9 been stricken or amended by said sections fifty-four, fifty-hour C,
10 fifty-four D of chapter fifty-three of the General Laws, as
11 most recently amended by chapter two hundred and thirty of
12 the acts of nineteen hundred and fifty-eight, or by any other
13 law relative to such conventions, are hereby revived as they
14 existed immediately prior to such striking or amendment,
15 subject, however, to all subsequent amendments not relating
16 to such conventions, all of which subsequent amendments are
17 hereby continued in force.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE REGISTRATION OF VOTERS IN THE SEVERAL COUNTIES OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in Assembly convened for that purpose, on the 10th day of February, 1850.
