The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Nine.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT CANDIDATES FOR A WARD OR TOWN COMMITTEE SHALL BE VOTED FOR AS INDIVIDUALS AND NOT AS A GROUP.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 34 of chapter 53 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking out the words "for ward or town
3 committees and" in the first line of the fourth paragraph and
4 adding at the end of said paragraph the following sentence:—
5 Candidates for ward or town committees shall be voted for as
6 individuals and not as a group.

1 SECTION 2. Section 35 of chapter 53 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking out the second sentence and in-
3 serting in place thereof the following sentence:— A cross in the
4 circle at the head of a group of candidates for delegates or alter-
5 nate delegates to national conventions shall count as a vote
6 for each candidate therein.
