**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Nine.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING EMPLOYMENT BY A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF CERTAIN PERSONS WHO HAVE ATTAINED AGE SEVENTY.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Chapter 32 of the General Laws is hereby amended by in-
- 2 serting after section 102 the following section:—
- 3 *Section 103.* Nothing in this chapter shall prevent the em-
- 4 ployment by a political subdivision of the commonwealth of a
- 5 person who has reached the age of seventy who is not, has not
- 6 been and does not become a member of the system provided
- 7 that said employment does not constitute creditable service
- 8 and that the compensation from all such employment does not
- 9 exceed one thousand dollars in a calendar year.

### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT AUTHORIZING EXPENDITURE BY A JOINT AND SEVERAL BOARD OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF CERTAIN MONIES WHICH HAVE BEEN PAID TO THE STATE.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:

1. Chapter 23 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting the section following—
2. Section 103. Nothing in this chapter shall prevent the expenditure by a political subdivision of the Commonwealth of a portion of a bill received for the use of money which has not been paid, does not become a member of the system provided that said expenditure does not constitute a public service and that the compensation therefor shall be paid in a calendar year.
