## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Nine.

---

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE STATE AUDITOR SHALL MAKE AN ANNUAL AUDIT OF ANY PRIVATE CHARITABLE ORGANIZATION RECEIVING STATE FUNDS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 12 of chapter 11 of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by adding the following sentence:—All private  
3 charitable organizations receiving funds from the common-  
4 wealth shall allow the department to make an annual audit  
5 of their accounts, and in the event of the refusal to grant  
6 such permission, the auditor shall notify the treasurer of the  
7 commonwealth.
