AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE ENFORCEMENT OF THE LAW RELATING TO LOTTERIES AND THE DISPOSAL OF PROPERTY BY CHANCE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 7 of chapter 271 of the General Laws, as amended by
- 2 chapter 115 of the acts of 1968, is hereby further amended by
- 3 adding at the end the following paragraph:—
- 4 The provisions of this section shall not apply to non-profit,
- 5 charitable and religious organizations.

By House Bill 1077, introduced and passed by the House on March 7, 1913, the following provisions were inserted in Chapter 107 of the Statutes of the State of Wisconsin, to read:

The Commissioner of Education

In the first section of Chapter 107 of the Statutes of the State of Wisconsin.

An Act to amend the Constitution of the State of Wisconsin, to read:

Article I, Section 11 of the Constitution of the State of Wisconsin, to read:

- 1. The Board of Education shall be composed of not more than five members, to be elected by the voters of the district in which they reside.
- 2. The Board of Education shall have the honor and privilege of the Senate of the State.
- 3. The Board of Education shall have the right to call and receive evidence in all cases.
- 4. The Board of Education shall have the right to subpoena witnesses and examine them.
