## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Nine.

RESOLVE TO DIRECT THE MASSACHUSETTS COMMISSION ON AGING TO STUDY CERTAIN PROBLEMS WITH RESPECT TO EMPLOYMENT.

1 *Resolved*, That the Massachusetts commission on aging,  
2 created by section seventy-three of chapter six of the General  
3 Laws, is authorized and directed to make and promote a  
4 study of the problems of the aging with respect to job training  
5 and retraining, employment opportunities including part-  
6 time employment for the aging, and the dissemination to  
7 employers and the aging of information regarding the avail-  
8 ability of the aging for employment and job opportunities  
9 for the aging. In carrying out this study the commission is  
10 authorized to make use of the resources of the several state  
11 departments which deal with the problems of the aged and  
12 cooperate with them. The commission shall also study any  
13 areas which it deems related to those heretofore mentioned.  
14 The commission shall report to the general court the results  
15 of its study and make recommendations for the resolutions of  
16 these problems and shall propose whatever legislation is  
17 necessary to implement its recommendations by filing the  
18 same with the clerk of the house of representatives on or  
19 before December first, nineteen hundred and sixty-eight.
