AN ACT REQUIRING EACH CITY AND TOWN TO SHARE IN THE DEFICIT OF THE NET COST OF OPERATION OF THE MASSACHUSETTS BAY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Sections eight, nine, ten and eleven of chapter
2 one hundred and sixty-one A of the General Laws are hereby
3 repealed.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter 161A of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after section 7 the following sec-
3 tion:—

4 *Section 7A.* In any year commencing with the calendar
5 year nineteen hundred and seventy, if the commonwealth
6 shall be called upon to pay any amount on account of the net
7 cost of local or express service for the previous calendar year
8 provided in the seventy-eight cities or towns, whether pro-
9 vided by ownership, lease, contract, or otherwise, the same
10 shall be assessed upon all the cities and towns throughout the
11 commonwealth in proportion to the population of each.

The Constitution of the State of New York

in the Year 1787, as amended and corrected

As the Constitution of the State of New York is now in force, it is necessary to
 to the best of our power to give a correct and complete copy of the same, as

It is ordered by the Senate and Assembly of the State of New York, that

Section 1. Section eight of the Constitution of the State of New York
 is hereby amended so that it shall read as follows:

Section 2. Chapter 101 of the General Laws of the State of New York
 is hereby amended so that it shall read as follows:

Section 2A. In any year commencing with the calendar
 year which is divided into two years, if the same shall
 be called upon to pay any amount or amount of the tax
 of one or more years for the present and next year
 provided in the several chapters or laws which are pro-
 vided by or under the laws of the State of New York
 shall be assessed upon all the cities and towns throughout the
 State in proportion to the population of each.
