By Messrs. Ambler of Weymouth and Connell of Weymouth, petition of Robert B. Ambler and William A. Connell, Jr., that the Metropolitan District Commission be directed to construct an ice-skating rink on a portion of the James T. O'Sullivan Park in the town of Weymouth. Urban Affairs.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION TO CONSTRUCT AN ICE-SKATING RINK ON CERTAIN LAND IN THE TOWN OF WEYMOUTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The metropolitan district commission is hereby
2 authorized and directed to construct an ice-skating rink on a
3 portion of land at the southwesterly end of James T. O'Sullivan
4 park, as shown on town of Weymouth Atlas, Sheet 7, Block 25,
5 lot 1.

1 SECTION 2. For said purpose said commission may expend
2 such sums as may be appropriated therefor.

The House of Representatives of the State of Wisconsin, in regular session, do hereby enact and publish the following laws: Chapter 1181, to amend the laws relating to the organization of the State of Wisconsin, and to provide for the election of a Governor and a Lieutenant Governor.

The Constitution of Wisconsin

Article I. The Executive Power.

SECTION 1. The executive power shall be vested in the Governor and Lieutenant Governor, who shall hold their offices for a term of four years, and shall be eligible for re-election.

SECTION 2. The Governor and Lieutenant Governor shall be elected by the people of the State at the general election, and by the majority of the votes cast thereon.

SECTION 3. The Governor shall be elected in the year 1848, and in every fourth year thereafter, and shall hold his office until the first day of January next following the day of his election. The Lieutenant Governor shall be elected in the year 1848, and in every fourth year thereafter, and shall hold his office until the first day of January next following the day of his election.

SECTION 4. The Governor and Lieutenant Governor shall be elected by the people of the State at the general election, and by the majority of the votes cast thereon.
