AN ACT REQUIRING EMPLOYMENT AGENCIES TO FURNISH INFORMATION ON THEIR ACTIVITIES TO DEPARTMENT OF LABOR AND INDUSTRIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 46Q of chapter 140 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after the word "license", in line 7, the
3 words:—and to make a record of such information, and to
4 require each agency to furnish, on a form supplied by the de-
5 partment of labor and industries, any or all such information;
