AN ACT REQUIRING THE COMMONWEALTH TO REIMBURSE CITIES AND TOWNS FOR THE NET COST OF MAINTAINING CERTAIN JUNIOR COLLEGES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking
2 out section 78, and inserting in place thereof the following sec-
3 tion:—

4 *Section 78.* The commonwealth shall annually pay the full
5 maintenance sum, after deducting such amounts as may be paid
6 for tuition, to cities and towns maintaining extended courses of
7 instruction under sections seventy-five to seventy-seven, in-
8 clusive, which have been approved by the commissioner as to
9 organization, location, equipment, courses of study and condi-
10 tions of admission.
