RESOLVE REVIVING AND CONTINUING THE SPECIAL COMMISSION
RELATIVE TO THE COURTHOUSE FACILITIES IN THE COMMONWEALTH.

1 *Resolved*, That the special commission, established by
2 chapter one hundred and twenty-six of the resolves of
3 nineteen hundred and sixty-five and revived and continued
4 by chapter eighty-two of the resolves of nineteen hundred
5 and sixty-seven, is hereby revived and continued. Said com-
6 mission shall file its final report on or before the fourth
7 Wednesday of December, nineteen hundred and sixty-nine.
