AN ACT PROVIDING FOR PAYMENTS FOR UNUSED SICK LEAVE TO RETIRED EMPLOYEES IN THE CITY OF BOSTON AND SUFFOLK COUNTY OR TO BENEFICIARIES DESIGNATED BY EMPLOYEES WHO DIE IN SERVICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any provisions of law to the contrary, any
2 person employed by the city of Boston or Suffolk county who
3 retires from service without having used his accumulated sick
4 leave shall be paid by said city from the same source from
5 which his salary was paid an amount equal to one half the
6 value of his accumulated sick leave based on his salary at
7 the time of his retirement. If such an employee does not
8 retire, but dies in service, the same award shall be paid to
9 the beneficiary named by him to receive his accumulated
10 deductions, or if no beneficiary has been named, to his estate.

The Amendment of Chapter 243
