RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE FEASIBILITY OF IMPOSING FACT FINDING AND COMPULSORY ARBITRATION IN DISPUTES INVOLVING EMPLOYEES OF THE COMMONWEALTH AND ITS POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS AND EMPLOYING AGENCIES.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission, to consist of three
2 members of the senate, five members of the house of repre-
3 sentatives, and three persons to be appointed by the gov-
4 ernor, is hereby established for the purpose of making an
5 investigation and study relative to the advisability of grant-
6 ing to employees of the commonwealth and its political
7 subdivisions the right to impose fact finding on the employ-
8 ing agency and the feasibility of compulsory arbitration in
9 disputes between such employees and their employing units
10 and any other related matters thereto.
