AN ACT TO PERMIT CITIES AND TOWNS TO USE CHAPTER NINETY FUNDS FOR STREET LIGHTING ON SO CALLED CHAPTER NINETY ROADS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Subsection 2 (a) of section thirty-four of chapter ninety
2 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the
3 first sentence thereof and substituting the following:—(a) For
4 expenditure, under the direction of said department, for
5 maintaining, repairing, improving and constructing town and
6 county highways, including proper street lighting, together
7 with any money which any town or county may appropriate
8 for said purposes to be used on the same highways.

1. The first object of the Commission was to ascertain the extent of the land owned by the State.
2. The second object was to ascertain the value of the land owned by the State.
3. The third object was to ascertain the manner in which the land owned by the State should be disposed of.
4. The fourth object was to ascertain the manner in which the land owned by the State should be managed.
5. The fifth object was to ascertain the manner in which the land owned by the State should be improved.
6. The sixth object was to ascertain the manner in which the land owned by the State should be protected.
7. The seventh object was to ascertain the manner in which the land owned by the State should be surveyed.
8. The eighth object was to ascertain the manner in which the land owned by the State should be recorded.
