AN ACT PROHIBITING THE USE OF POLL WORKERS AT CITY, TOWN, COUNTY, STATE AND NATIONAL ELECTIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of any general
2 or special law to the contrary, it shall be illegal for a
3 candidate for nomination or election to any elected office in
4 the commonwealth, or for any candidate for national election
5 to use poll workers at precincts under the control and
6 jurisdiction of the several cities and towns in the common-
7 wealth.

1 SECTION 2. Violation of this chapter shall result in a fine of
2 one hundred dollars for each offense.
