AN ACT RELATIVE TO RETIREMENT BENEFITS OF CERTAIN VETERANS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 57 of chapter 32 of the General Laws is
2 hereby amended by striking out the words "allowance for
3 maintenance payable to him while he was holding the grade
4 held by him at his retirement and payable from the same
5 source" in lines 9, 10 and 11, as appearing in section 2 of
6 chapter 668 of the acts of 1950, and inserting in place thereof
7 the words:—non-cash allowance for maintenance in the form
8 of full or partial boarding and housing:—and by striking out
9 the word "sixty-five", in line 13, as so appearing, and
10 inserting in place thereof the word:—seventy-two.

1 SECTION 2. Section 58 of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as
2 most recently amended by chapter 700 of the acts of 1968, is
3 hereby further amended by striking out the words "mainte-
4 nance allowance, payable to him while he was holding the
5 grade held by him at his retirement, and payable from the
6 same source", as appearing in lines 9 and 10, and inserting in
7 place thereof the following words:—non-cash allowance for
8 maintenance in the form of full or partial boarding and
9 housing.
