AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING CLUBS LICENSED UNDER THE ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES CONTROL LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 12 of chapter 138 of the General Laws, as most
2 recently amended, is hereby further amended by adding at the
3 end thereof the following paragraph:—

4 No holder of a club license under this section shall publicly
5 advertise for business or solicit patronage from the general
6 public.
