### AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF WATERTOWN TO PAY A SUM OF MONEY TO CERTAIN HOURLY WAGE EMPLOYEES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 For the purpose of discharging a moral obligation, the  
2 town of Watertown is hereby authorized to appropriate the  
3 sum of thirty-five hundred and sixty-five dollars and after such  
4 appropriation the treasurer of said town is hereby authorized  
5 to pay to each hourly wage employee of the park department,  
6 cemetery department, water department, tree department  
7 and highway department and the parking meter collector and  
8 maintenance man a days wages for October twelfth, nineteen  
9 hundred and sixty-eight, which occurred on a Saturday and  
10 which was agreed upon in the nineteen hundred and sixty-  
11 eight Collective Bargaining Agreement as a paid holiday, pay-  
12 ment therefor being legally unenforceable under the by-laws  
13 of said town.

THE STATE OF NEW YORK: THE TOWN OF WATERTOWN TO PAY A SUM OF  
MONEY TO CERTAIN EMPLOYEES WORKING THEREON.

It is enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in  
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as  
follows:

- 1 For the purpose of discharging a moral obligation, the
- 2 town of Watertown is hereby authorized to appropriate the
- 3 sum of thirty-five hundred and sixty-five dollars and fifty cents
- 4 appropriated for the purpose of said town to be paid to certain
- 5 persons to-wit: James A. Allen, for his services as
- 6 engineer, department of water department, town of Watertown,
- 7 and highway department and the village of Watertown and
- 8 maintenance man a day wages for October 1907, and for
- 9 board and extra-light, which is agreed to be a reasonable and
- 10 just sum of money for the services rendered and for
- 11 light and other things as aforesaid on a pro rata basis.
- 12 And that the said sum of money be paid to the said persons
- 13 in full for their services as aforesaid under the provisions
- 14 of this act.
