

By Mr. Creedon of Brockton, petition of the Massachusetts State Association of Journeymen Barbers, Hairdressers, Cosmetologists and Proprietors for legislation to increase the salaries of the members of the Board of Registration of Barbers and prohibiting them from engaging in any other occupation or business. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Nine.

AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARIES OF THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF REGISTRATION OF BARBERS AND PROHIBITING THEM FROM ENGAGING IN ANY OTHER OCCUPATION OR ANY BUSINESS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 39 of chapter 13 of the General Laws, as
2 appearing in chapter 200 of the acts of 1962, is hereby
3 amended by striking out the second sentence.

1 SECTION 2. Said chapter 13 is hereby further amended by
2 striking out section 41, as most recently amended by section 2
3 of chapter 676 of the acts of 1957, and inserting in place
4 thereof the following section:—

5 *Section 41.* The members of the board shall devote full
6 time to the duties of their offices and shall not engage in any
7 other employment or occupation or in any profession, prac-
8 tice or business. They shall receive from the commonwealth
9 the following salaries: the chairman, eighty-five hundred
10 dollars and his necessary expenses incurred in the discharge of
11 his official duties, each of the other two members, sixty-five
12 hundred dollars and his necessary expenses so incurred, and
13 the secretary to the board shall receive seventy-five hundred
14 dollars; provided, that the salaries and expenses of the

15 members of the board shall not be in excess of the receipts for
 16 registration and from other sources received by the state
 17 treasurer from the board. The secretary of the board shall
 18 receive from the commonweath a salary of four thousand
 19 dollars.

1 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect on July first, nineteen
 2 hundred and sixty-three.
