

By Mr. Flannery of Taunton, petition of Charles L. Flannery that provision be made for a salary differential for certain state employees required to work evening and night tours of duty and for Saturday and Sunday work. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Nine.

AN ACT PROVIDING SALARY DIFFERENTIALS FOR EVENING AND NIGHT TOURS OF DUTY AND FOR SATURDAY AND SUNDAY WORK.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. An employee of the commonwealth who is
2 assigned an evening tour of duty, as defined in section three
3 hereof, shall receive, in addition to the salary to which he is
4 otherwise entitled, an evening differential of ten per cent of
5 said salary.

1 SECTION 2. An employee of the commonwealth who is
2 assigned a night tour of duty, as defined in section three
3 hereof, shall receive, in addition to the salary to which he is
4 otherwise entitled, a night differential of fifteen per cent of
5 said salary.

1 SECTION 3. *Definitions.*—(a) The evening tour of duty
2 shall be one which commences at two o'clock postmeridian or
3 thereafter and ends at two o'clock antemeridian or thereto-
4 fore.

5 (b) The night tour of duty shall be one which commences
6 at nine o'clock postmeridian or thereafter and ends at nine
7 o'clock antemeridian or theretofore.

1 SECTION 4. An employee of the commonwealth who is
2 assigned to work on a Saturday shall receive, in addition to

3 the salary to which he is otherwise entitled, the sum of
4 twenty-five cents an hour.

1 SECTION 5. An employee of the commonwealth who is
2 assigned to work on a Sunday shall receive, in addition to the
3 salary to which he is otherwise entitled, the sum of thirty-five
4 cents an hour.
