AN ACT REDUCING THE TIME FOR STATE EMPLOYEES TO REACH THEIR MAXIMUM SALARY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding a provision of general or special law to
2 the contrary, employees of the commonwealth who receive
3 compensation under the provisions of section forty-six of
4 chapter thirty of the General Laws shall, after completing the
5 probationary period of six months at the minimum salary; be
6 granted a step increase in the salary schedule and shall
7 continue to receive a step increase each six months thereafter
8 until the maximum salary is received at the completion of
9 three years service.
