AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE EXPENSES OF THE ADVISORY BOARD OF THE MASSACHUSETTS BAY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 7 of chapter 161A of the General Laws
2 is hereby amended by deleting the fifth paragraph thereof
3 and inserting the following new paragraph:—

4 The advisory board may incur expenses, not to exceed
5 forty thousand dollars annually, for research, administration,
6 and stenographic and clerical work, and such expenses, in-
7 curred after July third, nineteen hundred and sixty-four, shall
8 be paid by the authority.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

1. Section 1 of chapter 1014 of the laws of 1881 is hereby amended by striking the fifth paragraph thereof and inserting the following new paragraph:—
2. The salary board may from time to time
3. pay the salaries of judges annually, for services as such judges,
4. and the salaries of clerks and other officers of the courts, in
5. accordance with the provisions of this chapter, and the salaries of
6. judges and clerks of courts shall be paid by the authority

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
