AN ACT REQUIRING LOCAL HOUSING AUTHORITIES TO DEVELOP COMPREHENSIVE PLANNING FOR COMMUNITY FACILITIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Clause (d) of section 26FF of chapter 121 is
2 hereby amended by adding the following sentences: — The
3 authority shall be required to develop a comprehensive pro-
4 gram of available community services in order to insure the
5 best utilization of the community facility and that the author-
6 ity shall receive the approval of the commission on aging as
7 to the acceptancy of said program. In addition, the authority
8 shall be required to consider use of the community facility
9 by all the elderly in the community.
