AN ACT DIRECTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH TO MAKE CERTAIN IMPROVEMENTS AT LAKE QUINSIGAMOND IN THE CITY OF WORCESTER AND THE TOWNS OF SHREWSBURY AND GRAFTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The department of public health is hereby authorized and
2 directed to chemically treat the waters of Lake Quinsigamond
3 in the city of Worcester and the towns of Shrewsbury and
4 Grafton for the control of nuisance aquatic vegetation. In
5 the conduct of such work said department shall consider the
6 public health, recreational, and other interests which may be
7 involved. For such purpose, said department may expend for
8 expert services, equipment, personnel, and other expenses
9 including chemicals such sums as may be appropriated
10 therefor.

AN ACT PROMPTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH TO MAKE CERTAIN IMPROVEMENTS IN LAKE QUINSIGAMOND IN THE CITY OF WORCESTER AND THE TOWN OF SOUTHWICK BY AND THROUGH THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS.

Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The department of public health is hereby authorized and directed to annually from the water of Lake Quinsigamond in the city of Worcester and the town of Southwick and to enter for the control of nuisance animals, vegetation, and the content of such water and department shall consider the public health, animals and other interests which may be affected. For such purposes said department may expend for expert services, equipment, personnel, and other expenses including chemicals such sums as may be appropriated.
