AN ACT REMOVING CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION FROM THE JURISDICTION OF THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT POLICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any provision of chapter twenty-eight or
2 chapter ninety-two of the General Laws to the contrary, no
3 employee of the metropolitan district commission, other than
4 a police officer or a clerical employee directly engaged in police
5 work, shall be supervised, directed or controlled by any member
6 of the metropolitan district police while in the performance of
7 his duties. Such employee shall be under the jurisdiction of the
8 commissioner or any subordinate employee, other than a police
9 officer, whom he may designate.
