AN ACT PROVIDING FOR HOLIDAYS FOR STATE EMPLOYEES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 24A of chapter 30 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting in the first sentence after the words
3 "of chapter four", and before the words "he shall be given"
4 the words:—and March seventeenth, June seventeenth, Good
5 Friday, April nineteenth and the birthday of each employee.
