By Mr. Sacco of Medford, petition of George L. Sacco, Jr., for legislation relative to the compensation of certain department heads. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Nine.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE COMPENSATION OF CERTAIN DEPARTMENT HEADS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 2 of chapter 22 of the General Laws as
2 amended by chapter 844 of the acts of 1967 is hereby further
3 amended by striking out the second sentence and inserting in
4 place thereof the following sentence:—The commissioner
5 shall receive such salary not exceeding twenty-five thousand
6 dollars as the governor may determine, and shall devote his
7 full time during business hours to the duties of his office.

1 SECTION 2. Section 9 of chapter 16 of the General Laws as
2 amended by chapter 844 of the acts of 1967 is hereby further
3 amended by striking out the third sentence and inserting in
4 place thereof the following sentence:—He shall serve for a
5 term co-terminous with that of the governor and shall receive
6 a salary not exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars.

1 SECTION 3. Section 12 of said chapter 16 as amended by
2 chapter 844 of the acts of 1967 is hereby further amended by
3 striking out the second sentence in the first paragraph and
4 inserting in place thereof the following sentence:—The di-
5 rector shall receive such salary not exceeding sixteen thou-
6 sand dollars as the governor and council may determine
7 which shall be paid out of the recreational boating fund.

1 SECTION 4. Section 2 of chapter 25 of the General Laws as
2 amended by chapter 801 of the acts of 1963 is hereby further
3 amended by striking out the fifth sentence and inserting in
4 place thereof the following sentence:—The chairman shall
5 receive such salary, not exceeding twenty thousand dollars,
6 and each of the other commissioners such salary not exceed-
7 ing sixteen thousand, five hundred dollars as the governor
8 and council may determine.

1 SECTION 5. Section 1 of chapter 16 of the General Laws as
2 amended by chapter 844 of the acts of 1967 is hereby further
3 amended by striking out the seventh sentence and inserting
4 in place thereof the following sentence:—The commissioner
5 shall receive a salary of twenty-five thousand dollars, and
6 each associate commissioner shall receive a salary of twenty-
7 two thousand, five hundred dollars, and each shall devote his
8 full time during business hours to the duties of his office.

1 SECTION 6. Section 2 of chapter 28 of the General Laws as
2 amended by chapter 801 of the acts of 1963 is hereby stricken
3 out and the following sentence inserted in place thereof:—
4 The commissioner shall receive such salary not exceeding
5 twenty-five thousand dollars, and each associate commis-
6 sioner such salary not exceeding eight thousand dollars as the
7 governor and council shall determine, and the commissioners
8 shall devote their full time during business hours to the duties
9 of the office.
