The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Nine.

AN ACT TO RE-VALUE, TAX AND ASSESS THE ESTATE INTEREST OF EACH AND EVERY ESTATE FAIRLY AND EQUALLY WITHOUT DISCRIMINATION, SO AS TO CONFORM WITH THE INTENT OF THE CONSTITUTION OF THE COMMONWEALTH OF MASSACHUSETTS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The owners of property shall be assessed taxes on the amount
2 of equity of value of such property equally apportioned where-
3 by the estate value of every person be taxed fair and without
4 discrimination, from that of a title holder or as against any
5 other owner interest; all equity owner interest shall be assessed
6 and billed as to the per cent of their equity interest, that shall
7 be confirmed and sworn to by every owner of value of property
8 and submitted to the assessor or assessors of said city, town,
9 or county within the commonwealth of Massachusetts.
